**Common Kinds of Earthworms**  
You might see these different species (or kinds) of earthworms in your yard or neighborhood:

 Nightcrawler	The Nightcrawler is a large, reddish brown earthworm that digs deep in the soil.	 Jumping Worm
 Red Wigglers	Red Wigglers like to live in groups. They are best known as composters because they eat large amounts of decaying vegetation.	
	Jumping Worms are new to our area. They live close to the top of the soil and can destroy plants. They are an invasive species, so be on the lookout for these guys!
